

Parents are expected to:

- Recognise that the education of children is a joint responsibility of the parents and the school community.
- Parents are requested to acquaint themselves fully with the rules and abide them. In order to secure all that is best in the education of your child, the maximum cooperation between parents and school authorities is necessary.
- Parents must take a serious note of all the notes made in the almanac and counter sign it regularly.
- Parents or guardians should see that their ward comes to school in neatly dressed full uniform. Both the parents should be present on parent – teachers meeting held during the year.
- Parents/Guardians are not allowed to see the student or meet the teachers during school hours without the permission of the principal.
- Special reports of the student's conduct, Application, progress and attendance are issued by the school after tests and examinations. Parents should see that these reports are brought to them and take steps in time against the causes that impede the progress of their children. The parents must countersign these reports as a proof that they have seen them. Failure to do so may put the children to great inconvenience. They should keep an eye on the attendance and academic reports too.
- Parents should encourage children to take part in the co-curricular activities of the school.
- The school must be informed of any change in the home address of the students especially contact numbers.
- Help your children understand that in a democratic society appropriate rules are required to maintain a safe, orderly environment.
- Ensure that children only bring items appropriate and related to the instructional program at school.
- Know School and classroom rules and helps your child understand them. Convey your child to have a supportive attitude towards education, peers, and people in surrounding.
- Build good relationships with teachers, friends and peers.
- Guide your child to deal effectively with peer pressure.
- Inform school officials of changes in the residential address that may affect student security, performance, or conduct.
- Insist your child to be well dressed and groomed in a manner consistent with the student dress code.
- Provide a conducive study place for student, and ensure homework is completed.
